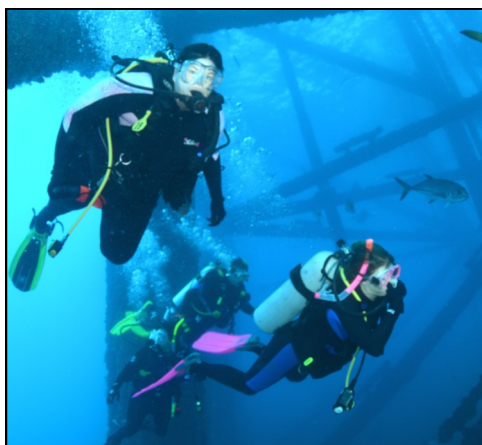




DOWN UNDER OUT YONDER (DUOY)

This 5-day expedition includes a 2-day *Coral Reefs to Classrooms* workshop followed by three days of diving the coral reefs of Flower Garden Banks National Marine Sanctuary, which harbors the northernmost coral reefs in the continental US, providing habitat for a variety of fish, turtles, and sharks. Participants return to their classrooms filled with innovative ideas for teaching biology, oceanography, geology, physical science, government, and environmental science.
