

At the September 2020 State Board of Education (SBOE) meeting, the SBOE approved for first reading and filing authorization for new Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS) for the following high school science courses: Biology, Chemistry, Integrated Physics and Chemistry, and Physics. The official **public comment period is open until November 13**, and can be found here: TEA Public Comment.

The **NOAA Marine Debris Art Contest** is now open through December 15 for K-8 students.

<u>S.P.L.A.Sh</u> (Stopping Plastic Litter Along Shorelines) is currently creating and sharing educational programming about **marine debris**, the effects it has on our environment, and how we can help stop it. With lessons, data collection, and beach cleanups, the program aims to clean up Texas shorelines while also teaching children about science and nature.
